Introducing *One Man, Two Guvvors*

Welcome to the hilarious and riotous West End and Broadway hit *One Man, Two Guvvors*. Featuring a Tony Award-winning performance from host of the *The Late Late Show*, James Corden as the eternally famished servant Francis Henshall. Now being broadcast via YouTube to mark the launch of National Theatre at Home.

Fired from his skiffle band, Francis Henshall becomes minder to Roscoe Crabbe, a small time East End hood, now in Brighton to collect £6,000 from his fiancée's dad. But Roscoe is really his sister Rachel posing as her own dead brother, who's been killed by her boyfriend Stanley Stubbers.

The permanently ravenous Francis spots the chance of an extra meal ticket and takes a second job with one Stanley Stubbers, who is hiding from the police and waiting to be reunited with Rachel. To prevent discovery, Francis must keep his two guvvnors apart. Simple.

The production was originally captured by National Theatre Live whose state-of-the-art filming techniques are tailored specifically to each play. From close-ups that capture every flicker of emotion, to sweeping wide shots of the stage – you've got the best seat in the house. We hope you enjoy the show.
