The National Theatre has released rehearsal images for Larry Kramer's *The Normal Heart* a co-production with Fictionhouse, being performed in the Olivier Theatre in September 2021. Directed by **Dominic Cooke**, Kramer's largely autobiographical play about the AIDS crisis in 1980 New York has not been performed professionally in London since its European premiere in 1986.
